ALL UNIVERSITY ORCHESTRA 2024 Concerto & Aria Competition APPLICATION FORM GUIDELINES

GENERAL INFORMATION:

- All AUO members and CMU students who are studying privately—through the university or outside—are eligible to compete in this competition. <u>All participants must be registered as</u> <u>full-time students at the time of their audition</u>. If selected as a winner, the contestant must hold—at minimum—the status as a part-time CMU (or Pitt) student at the time of the 2024-2025 performance with the AUO. The first 10 applications will be given an audition time. Submissions that follow will be put on a waiting list and notified should a spot open.
- 2. One winner will be selected to appear as a soloist with the AUO during the 2024-2025 season. However, there is also a right to award more than one winner -OR- no winner.
- 3. The selected winner must be available during regular AUO rehearsals prior to the concert dates for the 2024-2025 season (Sundays 6:00-8:30 p.m. in the UC Studio Theater). The AUO will not compensate the performer's travel expenses nor is this a paid service.
- 4. Applications must be completed and submitted to AUO Music Director, Dr. Jeffrey Klefstad at <u>cmuauo@gmail.com</u> by <u>December 30, 2023</u>. *Late applications will not be accepted*.
- 5. The Competition will take place in CMU's <u>Kresge Theater</u> on <u>February 13, 2024</u> from <u>5:30-10:00pm</u>. *Please note that the time of the competition is subject to change but participants will be informed in a timely manner. This competition is private and not open to the public.
- 6. Applicants must provide a copy of their piece (with cuts clearly marked) for the adjudicators when they audition. <u>Email a copy to cmuauo@gmail.com by January 29, 2024</u>.
- 7. The winner will be notified within two weeks of the Competition and given a performance date for the following academic year (2024-2025).

REPERTOIRE:

- 1. Each performer is required to provide their own accompanist and is allotted twenty (20) minutes to present their piece (memorization is not required). The auditioned piece must be at least six (6) minutes but not exceed forty (40) minutes of performance time. All pieces must be pre-approved by the AUO Music Director.
- 2. If the piece is a multi-movement work under the maximum performance time, ALL movements the applicant wishes to perform—if selected as the winner—must be presented during the competition. We suggest cutting long 'interludes/introductions' to conserve time. Participants may choose to audition with only one movement of a concerto, though this is not desirable.
- 3. The repertoire choice <u>must be available through a U.S. publisher</u>, or available in the U.S. through a publisher/agent (i.e. Schirmer or Lucks Music)—<u>No Exceptions</u>. Due to limited rehearsal time, it is strongly recommended the performer choose repertoire at a moderate difficulty to ensure a quality performance.
