DESCRIPTION & PURPOSE OF THE ORGANIATION

Overview

Founded in 1997, the All University Orchestra (AUO) of Carnegie Mellon University is a student organization that provides its members the opportunity to continue exploring classical music and to further develop their overall musicianship. This organization, funded by the Department of Student Activities, is open to all members of the University community. It is comprised of three ensembles: AUO Symphony (symphonic orchestra); String Theory (string ensemble); and Flutonium (flute choir). Members can participate in one or all ensembles apart from placement auditions for the AUO Symphony.

Performance Opportunities

Each AUO ensemble performs one concert per semester—two concerts per academic year. In addition, every other year we host a *Concerto & Aria Competition* open to all musicians on campus—next competition will be held during the 2021-2022 academic year. We also **encourage members to collaborate with each other** to create chamber ensembles and additional performance opportunities for themselves.

AUDITIONS (AUO Symphony only)

- Audition Process
 - <u>New Members</u> to the AUO Symphony must submit an audition recording (e.g., YouTube, Vimeo) to the AUO Music Director following the criteria outlined on the AUO website <u>www.alluniversityorchestra.org</u>. Returning members do not need to re-audition.
 - Auditions are for assignment purposes only. Anybody who wants to participate in AUO <u>can</u> participate. *Please note that AUO Symphony members may be subject to a rotation assignment on repertoire due to size constraints. This most often pertains to flute, clarinet, and violin players.*
 - <u>New members</u> who do not play in the Fall 2020 semester, but plan to join Spring 2021, will need to send an audition video in early January. Those who want to play the entire year only need to audition once. *Please note that AUO Symphony members may be subject to a rotation assignment on repertoire due to size constraints. This most often pertains to flute, clarinet, and violin players.*

MEMBERSHIP DUES

• Each semester the AUO Board collects \$10 in membership dues from each member participating in the organization. These funds directed towards organization needs such as: social events, music purchases, hall rental, and etc. If you are involved with more than one of our ensembles, you need only pay once.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

- To truly contribute to the success and progress of this organization, we expect members to <u>make a personal</u> <u>commitment to the group</u> with regards to regular attendance at rehearsals and sectionals, fundraising, as well as participation in our concerts.
 - A. Weekly Rehearsals: Please arrive with enough time to unpack your instrument and warm-up so tuning can begin promptly. Being late for rehearsal can be disruptive, please plan accordingly.
 - B. Sectionals (AUO Symphony only): Each section will have a few sectionals spaced throughout the semester (2-4/semester) from 8:30 9:30 PM after full orchestra rehearsal. These sectionals are led by professionals and performance majors (and alumni) from the School of Music, who volunteer their time and expertise. Sectionals are an OPPORTUNITY. Your timely attendance is <u>expected</u> at all sectionals, which are included in the attendance policy.
 - C. Rehearsal Attendance: If you know or plan to miss a rehearsal, send notification to <u>cmuauo@gmail.com</u> with the date and reason of absence no later than Saturday at 12:00 AM prior to the next day's rehearsal. Doing so allows time for the Music Director to make necessary adjustments to the schedule. To participate in the concert at the end of the semester, you cannot exceed more than 3 absences and no more than one of these may be unexcused. However, this decision can be contested with the Music Director and the Board.
 - D. **Dress Rehearsal/Sound-Check:** Both are **mandatory** and is a vital time to become acquainted to a new performing space. Each member is responsible to plan ahead each semester by noting the dress rehearsal/sound-check and concert dates. Failure to attend a dress rehearsal without a valid excuse results in being barred from performing on stage for that semester. If you have to miss the Dress Rehearsal/Sound-Check, you must schedule a time to play selections from the concert repertoire for the Music Director. Otherwise, you will not be allowed to perform in the concert.

CONCERT PERFORMANCE ATTIRE:

The following attire is acceptable for concert dress:

-Black Long Skirt/Pants -Black or White Blouse -Black Coat (*optional*) -Black (Dress) Shoes -Tux, Black or Dark Suit (Dark blue is acceptable) -White Dress Shirt w/Bowtie or solid black tie -Black Dress Socks & Black (Dress) Shoes
